## **LEGION FAMILY PROJECT**

Veteran's Haven, Ancora, N. J. is geared to rehabilitate veterans. Only one other program out West is similar. The selection process demands entrants be drugfree. Once enrolled, participants get counseling and vocational training for up to two years. When released, their success rate is 70%

When the facility was given space eight years ago, it housed only eight vets. Expansion made that number grow to present full capacity of 52. Residents are not bedridden.

The beds there are fifty years old. Commander McCole, President Griffiths, and S.A.L. Commander Wingler seek help and financial support from the whole Legion Family. Replacement will cost \$292 apiece.

Seventy-three years ago, members of American journey to recover the body of Mexican aviator, Capt. Emilio Carranza. Carranza, likened to Charles Lindburgh, was returning to Mexico on a cross-country, good will flight in inclement weather when his plane crashed into the Pine Barrens of New Jersey in July of 1928.

Hearing that the captain's plane had gone down, the Mount Holly Post mobilized its members to cut a path through the underbrush to carry Carranza's body from Sandy Ridge back to Mount Holly. Once there, it was to be retrieved by representatives of the Mexican Consulate of New York. The actions of these members marked the start of an annual memorial service to remember this brave aviator from our neighbor to the south, Mexico.

Attending this year's service on July 14th were members of The American Legion, Auxiliary, and SAL, officers of the United States Armed Forces, Mexican Air Force, the Consul General of Mexico, the VFW, and the Elks as well as members of various Mexican associations from New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania.

This year's service was also marked by a visit from Ms. Guadalupe Carranza Del Vecchio, Emilio Carranza's only living sister. Attending the service for the first time in fifty years, she spoke to the attendees, thanking them for their attendance and continued remembrance of her brother.

There were also speeches from Arturo Carranza de la Pena, a descendant of Emilio Carranza, who is a college professor in Mexico, Colonel Jim Goodman of the USAF, Lt. Colonel Villalubos, Senior Air Attaché of the Mexican Air Force, and Department Commander Daniel McCole.

The site of the Carranza Memorial bears a stone marker that was erected by members of Post 11, and paid for through the efforts of Mexican schoolchildren. The marker is flanked by an American flag and Republic of Mexico flag, with the area around the marker displays newspaper articles reporting on the crash and death of Capt. Carranza. ## **NATIONAL CONVENTION**

August 24-26, 2001, brought representatives for a quarter million S.A.L. members together in San Antonio, Texas. The 30th National Sons of the American Legion Convention ran unopposed. In balloting, Cliff Smith (Mass.) was elected National Commander, Don Alsott (Maine), Vice Commander East, and Ed Marsden (N.J.), National Chaplain.

Things were well organized so meetings went quickly. Many areas even opted to caucus after the end of the Sons' sessions. Our state handed in \$759.00 to CWF, Wildwood Convention donations. The convention closed in time for 54 delegations to find their way to the parade route.

Leading the march were newly elected national officers for the Legion, Auxiliary, and Sons. Jersey was honored to have its own Edward Marsden out in front. NEC James Noble, ANEC Neal Newlin, Vice Commanders Sean Howarth and Lukasz Marsden, Adjudant Thomas Marsden, DEC's Ken Esposito and Carl Albern joined behind to show support.

The triple digit heat took out Luc Marsden as he was returning to the Jersey lineup. While Neal Newlin and Sean Howarth carried Elsie Bailey's banner, Jim Noble, Tom Marsden, and Carl Albern served in the Legion Family Combined Honor Guard. State Department and Auxiliary members had Ed Marsden join them as they led a 100+ delegation of Legionnaires and Unit Members

Following the parade Department Commander Grifiths invited participants to the Four Seasons Sheraton Riverwalk for some hospitality and Mexican fare. Our Detachment should be grateful for the support that Past Commanders and Presidents have extended. The concept of the Legion Family is growing.
