

#### Flying Flags For Heroes. The project continues.

As memorial Day approaches, more of our Legion Family, as well as other groups such as fire departments and EMT squads, law enforcement, schools, churches, Scouts, individuals, and other groups are decorating the graves of veterans. The quest is to decorate ONE MILLION graves this year throughout the US. It CAN be done!

In Monmouth County NJ alone, there almost 44,000 veterans' graves listed. That's right, forty-four thousand. If forty thousand have Flags placed upon them, we are well on our way toward the national total. A quick tally, assuming around the same amount interred in each of the 21 counties of New Jersey, would bring our state's total to over 800,000 Flags placed!

National Commander Michael C. Fox reported at the NEC Meeting on 30-April, 200,000 Flags had already been placed nationwide.

#### American Legion and Sons of the American Legion donate to Commander's Project

At a meeting of the Essex County Executive Committee on St. Patrick's Day at Belleville Post 105, American Legion Post 105 and Sons of the American Legion (SAL) Squadron 105 donated \$1,000 each to the Department and De-tachment of NJ Commanders Projects,

which benefit veteran's programs local-

Each year, the American Legion Department of New Jersey, the American Legion's state-level organization in NJ, holds a Commanders Project, which is a joint project between the Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary, and the Sons of the American Legion raising money for various projects throughout the state. With the American Legion being deeply rooted in one of its "Four Pillars" focusing on Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation, these annual Commanders Projects go a long way to making a remarkable difference in the lives of thousands of New Jersey's military and veterans each year.

In a letter to the American Legion Family throughout New Jersey, Department Commander Daniel Dunn, an Air Force veteran, wrote "... I have chosen a learntment Project which forees on

Force veteran, wrote "... I have chosen a Department Project which focuses on the Veterans in need and Suicide Awareness, which I feel goes hand-inhand. Working together with our Legion Family, we will be able to accomplish a lot of great things not only improving the lives of Veterans but saving them as The state-wide 2021-2022 project goal was set at \$128,000 last year, which has since gone over-the-top. "This project is what we do as an

American Legion Family, helping Veter-ans in need" added SAL Detachment of NJ Commander Henry Hasselhan in a

mailing to his squadrons of Sons.

Specific programs within the Commanders Project, in addition to funding for homeless veterans and suicide awareness programs for vets, includes among other goals purchasing service dogs for veterans, funding for Hoboken Post 107's Veterans housing, and technology supplies for residents of the Menlo Park Veterans Home making it possible for those who are visually im-

possible for those who are visually impaired make phone calls.

At a meeting of the Essex County Executive Committee on 17 March at the Post 105 hall in Belleville, the Department and Detachment "Team Dunn" made their official visit to Essex County, with our of members of the Lorent to with over 40 members of the Legion, the Auxiliary, and the Sons from the county in attendance. It was at this meeting, at the invitation of Essex County Commander Terence Scantlebury, that many of the posts, units, and squadrons presented their donations to the Commander's Project. Attendees were also treated to 120-pounds of corned beef and cabbage courtesy of Post 105, as the visit happened on Saint Patrick's Day.

"It was an honor hosting this event," noted Squadron Commander Steve Sangemino on Facebook. "Shout out to


25April: BASKING RIDGE and EAST ORANGE, NJ – Sweet dreams are made of this.
