What a feeling to help people and make a difference in their lives.







The Flag Man by Gary S. Crawford

He comes in late April or early May. Quietly, with no fanfare, he comes in and does his annual job. He places small American flags on the graves of veterans, what the military calls "decorating the graves". What was formerly called Decoration Day came from this term.

Each veteran's grave gets a flag, measuring 12 by 18 inches, fastened to a 30-inch wooden dowel. Some years the finial is painted gold, other years it's black. The county Department of Veteran Affairs provides the flags.

Most cemeteries are assigned to a local Veterans' Post. The Post in turn would have its members help place the flags in time for Memorial Day. But some Posts have closed, leaving their respective cemeteries with no one to decorate the graves.

This man places flags at two such cemeteries. At one, he had served on its board of trustees and began placing the flags because no one else was doing it. The Post that once took care of flag placements lost its charter and closed.

At the other cemetery, its assigned Post had also closed. Since the man had many relatives interred there, he took an interest in making sure the graves were decorated. Veterans Affairs keeps a listing of Veterans in each cemetery and provides flags for that amount, even though many grave locations are unknown or lost. After placing flags for over twenty years, he has amassed a surplus, handy when having to replace those damaged or soiled.

The man takes his time. He knows where most of the graves are located without consulting maps or other paperwork. He goes to each grave, places a flag at the marker of the Veteran buried below, and then recites the name on the marker and hand salutes each one. Old flags that may still be there are gathered and retired at his American Legion Post at ceremonies on Flag Day.

He places almost 800 flags between the two cemeteries. Taking his time, one cemetery takes about six hours to complete, the other about four. He works a few hours each day, enjoying the peace and quiet of the cemetery. He seeks no help as no one seems to have the time. He'd rather work alone. He knows the job will be done right.

He doesn't see a cemetery as a macabre and sinister place to avoid, but a welcoming place of love, respect, dignity, and honor. He takes the opportunity to meditate while in the company of some very special people. He likes how it makes him feel.

People see the flags placed in so many cemeteries each May. They just assume that "they" put them there. This man is one of those called "they". The Flag Man.


